JUNE BLOCK OF THE MONTH

Let's Remodel our Log Cabins!

In the spirit of the last 15 months, when we were sequestered in our homes and perhaps dreamed of/did home makeover projects, how about doing the same with traditional log cabin blocks?

Ta – da!! The new year of Block of the month (BOM), starting June 2021 thru May 2022, will be Log Cabin blocks, remodeled.

In the classic quilt history book "The American Quilt" the author explains that the log cabin design made it's first appearance around the mid 1800's, Civil War era. The pattern was very popular and made with scraps, on muslin, no batting, and tied rather than quilted. (You could do this too!)

There are now hundred's of log cabin designs – not just varied in dark/light color placement or layout. How about trying Log Cabin Windows, Twirling Ribbons, Splitting Headache and Butterfly?

I'd like to challenge you (and me) to have some remodel fun in the next twelve months by making some different log cabin blocks. It will be a great way to use up scraps, and try something old in a new way.





WILD! ANIMAL COLLAGE WORKSHOP

My Wild! Animal Collage class is easy and fun. If you can color in a coloring book you can make a wonderful quilt in just a day or two! total beginners are just fine! Kids can do this! Send me a photo of your dog, for a custom pattern, or pick one of my animals or birds (see them in the gallery section of the website www.phylliscullenartstudio.com), and I'll send you a pattern to be enlarged, or a full-size pattern, or a full kit for any of them

My classes are always recorded for you so you can go back and review, stop, start, and enjoy them over and over.

We'll use print fabric scraps to fill in an outline of your favorite bird or animal dividing our scraps just by value and following a value pattern. You don't need to know how to draw, you can use one of my many pattern choices (horse, goat, turtle, rooster, dog, cat, lion, macaws, eagle) or bring your own enlarged photos to trace.

No measuring, no precise cutting. We are painting WITH fabric rather than ON it.

A layer of tulle, a bit of quilting, and you've created a wildly patterned, but totally believable, creature of your choice! No sewing in class, just tracing, a bit of slash and dash cutting, a touch of glue, and a sense of adventure!

You will need:

- Full size pattern and photo of my completed version of the pattern.
- ➤ Sheet of Steam-a-Seam 2, size of your finished project
 - This is 'sticky', it will hold your pieces as you build
- Three sets of fabric pieces with a variety of values (light, medium, dark)
 - Feel free to raid your scrap basket for more!
- ➤ A Sharpie marker, for tracing the pattern.
- ➤ A Glue Stick, for sticking down loose pieces.
- ➤ You will need a piece of fabric larger than your finished animal or bird(s) for background. You can audition your creature on various fabrics after the collage is made to see what you like for a background.
- ➤ Tulle, to be chosen after your image is on the background

Pattern of choice and full handout will be emailed to anyone who prefers not to purchase kit. kit includes full size pattern, steam a seam, fabrics to build the animal or bird(s), sharpie, glue stick, photo and tulle. You will need a fat quarter off fabric to place behind your subject. We audition for that after creating the animal. You'll also need batting and backing fabric.

What started as a quest to make a Mariner's Compass quilt for her submarine officer husband, Robin Long took an idea she had in 1992 and launched Robin Ruth Design in January, 2015. She has developed a line of revolutionary rulers, books, patterns and technique for making STRIP PIECED mariner's compass blocks in 16 sizes — that's right, NO PAPER PIECING!

A Washington State native, Robin grew up on a cattle ranch in Eastern Washington and, after a 7-year Navy stint with husband David, has lived in the Seattle area for over 25 years and together they have one daughter. Robin learned how to sew from her mother at a very young age and was later introduced to quilting by her grandmother in the mid 80's. Her degree is in Communications/Public Relations and she successfully ran and owned a gift store, Sun Prairie Trading Co., for 16 years with her mother. After closing the store and sending her daughter off to college, Robin refocused her attention on the ruler idea that had been in the back of her mind for over 20 years.

When she isn't on the road teaching and giving workshops, she is working on many new projects that bring the mariner's compass into the 21st century! Her products are sold in quilt shops across the U.S and around the world.

Forbidden Fruit Tree Pie (Sour Cream Apple)

Joanne Harris

1 unbaked pastry shell1 egg, well beaten2 cups chopped apples1 cup sour cream(Granny Smith are best)1/2 tsp vanilla3/4 cup sugar1/8 tsp salt

Fill pastry with apples. Mix other ingredients and pie over apples. Bake 400° for 15 minutes, then reduce to 325° for 30 minutes.

Topping

1/3 cup sugar 1/3 cup flour 1 tsp cinnamon 1/4 cup butter


Mix topping until crumbly. Place on baked pie and return to oven at 325° for 20 minutes.
