

QUILTS AND CARS on TOUR TWO PERSON TEAM MEMBER CHALLENGE

Two person teams will create two 24" square wall hangings, one will be painted on wood, the other one will be created in fabric and batting. The finished 24" pieces may consist of one or more block patterns, as long as the finished piece is a 24" square.

- **1.** Choose any quilt block pattern or patterns.
- **2.** One partner paints the design on a 24" board. It may be a single block interpretation or multiple blocks painted on one board. The finished board shall have two screw eyes, mounted on the finished top edge, of sufficient length and strength to support the board when hung. The screw eyes shall be set 4" in from the side edges.
- 3. The second partner sews an interpretation of the chosen designs. It may be a single block or may consist of multiple blocks on one wall hanging, as long as the finished piece is a 24" square.
- **4.** The finished piece shall have a two-inch casing on the back side that will accommodate a dowel, provided by the guild for the show, for displaying the piece.
- 5. The finished sewn piece requires a label on the back, the painted piece also requires a permanent inked label.
- Entry pieces will be displayed at a tour location that will feature Barn Quilts.
- First, second and third place awards shall be based on Peoples' choice voting.
- Completed entries are due at the **Tuesday**, **April12**, **2022** CQA general Meeting.

BLOCK OF THE MONTH

Is Spring maybe on the way? I'm looking out a window in my sewing room at the beautiful blooming bulbs, and that reminds me of a hobby I used to have – making stained glass windows.

Which used to be the title of the next BOM. Except now I've added an additional name - "Barn Quilts". Because I recently took a REALLY fun class from our guild's ex-President, Thelma Atkinson, "How to paint a barn quilt". I loved it. In fact, when I get a free moment (after making more log cabin blocks), I'm going to make an even bigger Barn Quilt. Maybe even use the March BOM as my pattern! And that's the fun of making Barn Quilts — inspiration is everywhere!

"Stained Glass Window/Barn Quilt" is our March BOM. It's got lots of triangles, but easy to do with foundation paper piecing. My sample uses only two colorways, but I would love to see what colors you choose. Just make sure to send your photo to our webmaster or bring it to our March meeting and I will get it posted for you.

The April BOM is called "Twister's a Comin", from the old book "101 Log Cabin Blocks" by Linda Causee. That block is titled Dorothy's Home, which honors one of the classic movies we all love, Wizard of Oz. This is a great block to use up your batik scraps.

Our March and April BOM will be posted on the CQA website around the first day of each month. You'll also receive an email notifying you when the patterns are posted and ready for printing.

A Mother's Heroic Heart Quilt is a nonprofit 501(c)3 Public Charity that makes personalized memorial quilts for the mothers of fallen law enforcement officers who died in the line of duty. Originally, the mother of a fallen officer designed the quilt pattern and founded her nonprofit. In December 2020, this courageous mom decided to scale back to just her own state of Indiana. Many of the quilters joined together are now quilting for A Mother's Heroic Heart Quilt. Please see our background story at the website amothersheroicheartquilt.org.

There are about volunteer quilters from all over the country, including several locally. All kits are provided at no cost to the volunteer. All appliques are cut and backed with fusible webbing. The embroidered centers are also provided. The only cost to the volunteer is time and thread. Being local will save on postage to return the finished quilts to me.
