
June 2023 BOM - Lady of the White House

Loretta Rising (pen name Nancy Cabot) was the Needle Work Editor and Columnist for the Chicago Tribune in the 1930's. Each day she featured a single quilt block with an illustration and information about its history. Our first BOM is from her column. Here are her notes:

"WHITE HOUSE (also called Lady of the White House) is one of the old pieced patterns and was designed shortly after 1865. It is fundamentally a four patch pattern, but one of the most elaborate examples of that type. Two shades of blue and white are combined with a deep ecru, but the effect of the various wings of the White House is readily seen in the completed block."

I'm using 2 color ways this year: (1) Americana Blues, Reds & Creams and (2) Batiks in blue, green & purple. But scrappy has a special charm too.

You will need 4 fabrics for this block; A print, a coordinating solid, a contrasting fabric and a background. All directions will be shown in the Americana fabrics.


<u>Cutting</u>

- Red Print four squares 3.5" two squares 4.25"
- Red solid one strip 1.5" x 13" two strips 1.5" x 7"
- Blue four squares 3.5"
- Cream two squares 4.25" two strips 1.5" x 13" one strip 1.5" x 7"

Step 1 - Half Square Triangles (HST)

There are lots of ways to make HST. This is one option but feel free to use your favorite :). Draw a diagonal line on back of cream 4.25" squares. Place RST(right sides together) on red print 4.25 squares. Sew 1/4 inch seam on both sides of the diagonal line. Cut on line. Press to red side and trim to 3.5". You will make 4 HST.





<u>Step 2 - 9-patches</u> Sew the two $1.5'' \ge 7''$ solid red strips to both sides of the $1.5'' \ge 7''$ cream strip. Press towards the red. Sub-cut into 4 pieces, 1.5'' wide.





Make a second strip set, sewing cream $1.5'' \times 13''$ strips to both sides of red solid $1.5'' \times 13''$ strip. Press to red. Sub-cut into 8 pieces, 1.5'' wide.



Layout sub-cut sections as shown and sew together. Seams will nest. Make 4 units.

Press towards the outside.



Step 3 - Assemble

Lay out all 16 pieces as shown. *** Watch direction of the center pinwheel.*** ***Cream against cream and red print against blue. **** Sew into 4 rows. When sewing HST together, the diagonal seams should nest together.



Press rows in directions shown.



Sew top 2 rows together and bottom 2 rows together, nesting seams. Press open.

Now join top and bottom sections, again nesting seams. Be careful to line up center point of pinwheel. Press open.



And that's it ! A beautiful block to start a new BOM series !
