

**Camarillo Quilters Association
Board Meeting Minutes
June 8, 2026**

Those present: Tedi Patterson (Vice-president), Jan Hunter (Membership), Barbara Witman (Secretary), Wendy Van Loo (President), Holly Winston (Ways & Means), Jonal Beck (Facilities), Kathy Antrobus (Treasurer), Joey Strait (Website and Speaker Contracts), Jane Osborne (Communications), Rosemary Tobin (Travel), and Jodie Solorio (Block of the Month) and Rose Gamboa (Workshops). Barbara MacDonald (Newsletter) joined part way through the meeting.

The meeting was called to order by President Wendy VanLoo at 10:32 AM. There is a quorum.

Jan Hunter moved, and Joey Strait seconded, to approve the Board meeting minutes from the May Board meeting. The motion passed unanimously.

Tedi Patterson moved, and Jan Hunter seconded, to approve the May General Meeting Minutes. The motion passed unanimously.

Barbara Witman reported that all the on-line apps are now accessible. Wendy asked Barbara to take care of changing the passwords and making them secure.

Wendy VanLoo reported that her son, Peter, will be at the meeting to help with Zoom issues.

Rose reported for the committee that the financial records were reviewed and passed with flying colors. Everything was fine. Tax reporting was done on time as well as the budget. Kudos to Kathy Antrobus for all her hard work. Financial reserve analysis showed that we are not required to raise the dues next year. Barbara Witman reported that the B of A account can be closed because the Square funds now go directly to Premier America accounts.

Rose Gamboa (**Vice-President**) reported she attended SCCQG's the last meeting. The next is on June 27 regarding social media how-to. Tedi Patterson (incoming Vice-President) is meeting with Rose today to make the necessary changes so that CQA board is correctly listed with SCCQG and the state of CA.

Wendy VanLoo requested that members should wear red, white, and blue at the July meeting.

Jan Hunter (**Membership**) reported that there were 2 new members, 27 renewals and 112 checked in at the May meeting. 133 Members have renewed so far, which is above this date last year.

Joey Strait (**Speaker Contracts**) that the July program leader is Susan from the Fabric Shoppe followed by a picnic in the park. Members should bring their own lunches. September is Yvonne Phenicie. CQA is sharing expenses with Valley Quiltermakers for this speaker. Joey stated she will not be at the meeting tomorrow. Wendy shared the sample for the October class, which is a very colorful purse with Rami Kim. Wendy will run the sign-ups in July for September and October workshops. In November, Marilyn Peterson is coming to give a lecture regarding Sew Wonderful ruler teacher. She will bring kits that are made with that ruler. Joey will ask her about a workshop on the Wednesday following her presentation. Jonal Beck volunteered to contact Minki Kim for a presentation in 2028. Rose suggested Gina Perkes as a potential speaker also. Tedi Patterson suggested contacting Brenda Logan, who gives free workshops via Zoom, including "Conquering Mount Scrapmore".

Joey Strait (**Website**) reported that she updated the website, so the programs are current.

Holly Winston (**Ways & Means**) reported that her group earned \$300 in May. Kelly DuBois will lead the Ways & Means group at the July meeting. Holly reported that one of the Santa Barbara sewing machine shops has donated a gift certificate for CQA to raffle. The donor may visit CQA members during the fall.

Speaker Hospitality is still vacant. That spot really needs to be filled.

Jodie Solorio (**Block of the Month**) shared the pattern for July. She will get the instructions to Joey for the website. The raffle for the previous year's participants will be in July. Tedi Patterson reported that her table was once again appropriated by another group. Discussion followed. Rose Gamboa suggested that simple signs be created for each group so that everyone has an assigned table. Jan Hunter shared the idea that it would be a good idea to display the mini quilts which were created during the last year of BOM. They are so interesting and unique. Jan and Pat will set up the display at the base of the stage.

Rose Gamboa reported for **Comfort Givers** that there will be 225 quilts to give away tomorrow.

Jonal Beck (**Facilities**) reported that she sent the floor plan via e-mail. CQA is currently paid up through October for the general meeting venue and workshops. She will reserve the venue for next year, hopefully for a year. Joey Strait will send Jonal a list of the workshop dates for the rest of 2026 and 2027.

Member Hospitality is another vacancy that needs to be filled. There are at least brownies coming to tomorrow's meeting.

No **Library** report.

Tedi Patterson won the soap bottle challenge. Lisa Gorski will set up a display tomorrow

Small Groups is another vacancy that needs to be filled.

Rosemary Tobin (**Travel**) reported that the Poinsettia Pavillion retreat is sold out. She will have packets tomorrow at the meeting. She is retrieving items for the retreat from storage tomorrow. The Orcutt retreat on Aug. 28-30 is not sold out yet. The cost is \$100 per person. There will be an opportunity to sign up at the meeting tomorrow.

Barbara MacDonald (**Newsletter**) will report tomorrow about the gift certificate from the Santa Barbara Sewing Center. The next deadline for the newsletter is July 15. Barbara suggested that CQA add a separate button to ask members to pay the credit card fee for a flat fee (maybe \$2 or \$3).

Joey Strait (**Website**) reported that the workshops are on the website for the rest of 2026 and 2027. The February workshop is a zoom workshop.

Jan Hunter asked if there were objections to promoting "Quilt on a stick" program at the **Ventura County Fair**. None were raised. The Fair's theme is "Carnival Fun". Pat Hibner and Jan Hunter will make a display.
